S.S.P.: We are all called to give ourselves totally to the Lord.

- I. Why are we here?
 - A. Many reasons
 - 1. To give witness to human life from the moment of conception
 - 2. To support each other
 - 3. To lobby politicians
 - 4. To pray
 - B. Other reasons
 - 1. Because we were asked
 - 2. It seemed it would be fun
 - C. My reason:
 - 1. To call you to a deeper commitment to the pro-life movement
 - 2. To call you to a deeper commitment to the Lord
- II. Before we protest that we are already deeply committed, let us recall St. Peter's protests to Jesus that he would never deny Him.
 - A. This is not a "once and done" deal, not "been there, done that."
 - B. To be pro-life is a life-time commitment.
- III. Test of our commitment: are we willing to follow the Church's teaching on contraception as well as abortion?
 - A. What's the connection?
 - B. Legally: *Griswold v. Connecticut* (1965) set the stage for *Roe v. Wade* (1973).
 - C. Medically: *New England Journal of Medicine* article (Dec. 7, 2017) concluding that contraception increases the risk of breast cancer for women.
 - D. Morally: Pope Paul VI's Encyclical Letter, *Humanae Vitae* (1968 50th anniversary).
- IV. We are all called to give ourselves totally to the Lord cf. Diocesan Synod and today's Gospel parable about the rich young man (*Matthew* 19:16-30).
