- I. “You must be strong with love, which is stronger than death.”
  - Pope St. John Paul II (June 10, 1979)
  - A. My episcopal motto is “The Law of the Heart is Love,” taken in part from today’s first reading from Jeremiah 31: “I will place my law within them, and write it upon their hearts.”
    - 1. What is this law? Romans 13: “Love is the fulfillment of the law.”
    - 2. This is described as a covenant: “I will be your God, you will be my people.”
    - 3. Marriage is a covenant between two people pledging themselves to each other.
  - B. In our second reading, St. Paul wrote, “over all these things, put on love.”
  - C. In the Gospel from St. John, Jesus says, “Remain in my love. . . . This is my commandment: love one another as I have loved you.”
  - D. What is love? It is “more than a feeling,” it is a decision to act in a certain way.
  - E. St. Thomas Aquinas says love is to will the best for the other person.
- II. Example of holy marriage lived by the Holy Family: Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.
  - A. St. Joseph showed his love by his actions, not words.
    - 1. Notice that Joseph never says a word in the Bible.
    - 2. Joseph listens to the message of God delivered by an angel and always does the right thing.
  - B. Mary showed her love for Jesus in both good times and bad, e.g., she was with Him at the Wedding at Cana and at the foot of the cross.

C. Jesus is at the center of the Holy Family, and should be at the center of our lives.

1. Story of the man who was having marital difficulties because he loved his wife too much.
2. If you love your spouse as a god or goddess, you expect perfection!
3. God must come first, and then everyone and everything else.
